\*\*\* A Mount Rainier property owner must complete and file this application with the Mount Rainier City Manager before undertaking any of the following actions on any private tree with a circumference equal to or greater than 56.5 inches at 4 ½ feet above the ground:

- Removing, relocating, destroying or topping the tree
- Pruning more than 25% of the live crown of the tree within a one-year period
- Pruning live limbs with a diameter equal to or greater than 30% of the diameter of the tree
- Cutting a root with a diameter of greater than one inch

## **DESCRIPTION OF PERMITTING PROCESS:**

1) Property owner must send or hand-deliver completed application to:

Mount Rainier City Manager One Municipal Place Mount Rainier, MD 20712

- 2) The city manager and city arborist will issue a recommendation granting or denying the permit within seven (7) days.
- 3) The applicant has the right to appeal the preliminary denial of any permit to the Mount Rainier Tree Commission within ten (10) days.
- 4) The Tree Commission then has fourteen (14) days to advise the Council and Mayor on its decision about the application.
- 5) If the application is approved, property owner will be responsible for replanting trees or paying restitution to the city, according a formula set forth in the Mount Rainier city code, Urban Forest section.

See Mount Rainier city code, Chapter 12B-8 and following subsections for a full description of the tree impact assessment criteria and tree replacement/restitution requirements.
