- January 2019 saw about the same number of incidents from 87 to 104. Included were 5 more reported suspicious person calls, 8 more suspicious auto calls, and 2 more parking complaints which show that citizens are “Seeing It” and “Reporting It”?
- The number of vehicle accidents was the same with 12.
- The increase of 17 incidents this month indicates calls for service by participating citizens being their own eyes and ears for their community for 15 of the 17 mentioned above.
- Theft from Auto and Theft combined were both 12 for November and December. Theft from Auto was 7 for both December and January. Theft was 6 for the month of January, up 2 from December. Theft from Auto had been, in May 14, in June 18, and in July, there were 17. October was 11 and November was 12 for theft From Auto.
- Overall, the level of crime incidents did not see a significant fluctuation during this month with 104 incidents reported.

We have continued to maintain at least minimum manpower with our patrol staff. Officers continue to volunteer to fill in the schedule as we accommodate Leave, so that we can maintain this standard. Focus of getting more community engagement has shown to make a difference as we gauge the number incidents most recently. The police department finished an upgrade to the video camera system so that we now have a state of the art system able to monitor activity around our building.
