Governor O'Malley Speaks on Foreclosure

At a recent National Governor's Association meeting in Washington Gov. Martin O'Malley emerges as a national figure on the risky home loan issue. At that meeting O'Malley discussed with his colleagues how states can reverse rising foreclosure rates. On a state level, O'Malley has pitched a series of bills in the state legislature to cut down on the number of risky loans. He also wants lawmakers to extend the period of time before delinquent can lose their homes. O'Malley has also summoned all Maryland loan officers to Annapolis to work on what he calls a new national model for customer service. According to O'Malley, some troubled homeowners have complained to the state that when they fall behind on their mortgage payments, they have difficulty getting in touch with various companies that hold their mortgages. In Maryland alone foreclosure rates have more than doubled in the last twelve months.

Basketball is COMING to Mount Rainier!

Thanks to Prince George's County's Public Schools' CEO John Deasey and School Board member Amber Waller afternoon basketball is coming to Mount Rainier. The City of Mount Rainier and the Town of Brentwood are working together to host a youth basketball developmental program. The youth program is aimed at providing recreational activities for youth ages 13 to 18 in the form of basketball. The program will also have a life skills component.

Program Details:

- Starting June 1, 2008 the youth basketball developmental program will kick off
- Doors will open at 6:00pm for registration and organizational meeting
- The City of Mount Rainier
- Thomas Stone Elementary School Gymnasium

This youth program will be year round and will focus on the fundamentals of the game of basketball and will educate youth on sportsmanship.

The City is partnering with Brentwood, Prince George's County Public Schools, Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission, Greater Rock Creek Baptist Church, and local businesses in this endeavor. Local youth and high school coaches, basketball coaching staff and basketball student-athletes will also participate in this program throughout the year.

The clinic will be open to boys and girls free of charge. Participants must register to participate in this program, and must complete all phases of the registration.

Parents and other community adults are invited to attend the life skills sessions of the program which will be held a minimum of four times during the year.

Clinic participants and volunteer coaches who participate in the clinic will be invited to evaluate the program throughout the year. Evaluations will be used to improve the program and provide feedback to the sponsors. **VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED** – coaches, teachers, mentors, etc. Financial donations are also needed. Mayor and Council Highlights for February 2008

Resolution 2-2008: There was a first reading and a public hearing on a resolution initiating an Urban Renewal Project by finding and defining a blighted area of the Mount Rainier Town Center Urban Renewal Area, authorizing the acquisition of the properties in the blighted area.

Ordinance on Recreational Vehicles: There was a second reading on an ordinance that would amend the law regarding recreational vehicles. Over the past few months, there have been a number complaints about large recreational vehicles parked on city streets and in drive ways. Right now a recreational vehicle has to be 25 feet from the street line. Since the front of some people's houses is less than 25 feet from the street, a recreational vehicle could be parked in a driveway back from the front of the house and still be in violation of the current ordinance even though it is not an 'eye sore'. The new ordinance says that a recreational vehicle may be parked 'not nearer to the street line...than the front facade of the house...'. (It also allows the City Manager to issue a permit for a recreational vehicle to be parked on the street for no more than a two-week period once every six months.)

Ordinance on Immigration: There was a 2nd reading and public hearing on an ordinance reaffirming the importance of immigrants to the Mount Rainier Community. This ordinance would establish city policy regarding federal immigration laws. On February 12th, mayor and council unanimously voted to table ordinance and revisit at a later date.

Message from Councilmember Tarlau:

What are your budget priorities?

The Council has started the process of discussing the budget for the next fiscal year starting in July. The final vote on next year's budget will be on June 17th after a bunch of meetings and public hearings.

Last week we received a report from our auditors and our city is in good financial shape.

We now have to decide what should be our priorities and we want to hear from you. We cannot do everything but I would like people e-mail me what they think are the top three things the Council should be doing that are different from what has been done in the past. Remember, we cannot do everything.

Here are some of the potential new programs for next year:

- Extra staff for street cleaning downtown (especially on the weekends)
- Increased funds for tree and tree stump removal
- Reducing the tax rate
- A new trash truck for public works
- Year round basketball program at Thomas Stone Elementary School
- Comfort station to replace portable toilets
- Additional summer recreational programs
- Additional funds for street/curb work
- Legal resources to clean up some of our vacant properties
- Additional staff to keep the police station open 24/7
- Money to make the new fire truck operational
- Additional collections of electronic and hazardous waste.

- Money to prepare for Mt. Rainier's centennial (2010)

Looking for an opportunity to increase the cultural heritage tourism potential in your area? Are you looking for funds to do an oral history project, offer arts program? Or are you trying to save an old building in your area; looking to start a business that would attract visitors? Do you need funds to help start a new program or sustain existing programs at your museum, cultural center, historic or natural site? If so, please read the following:

Applications for funding from the **Maryland Heritage Areas Authority (MHAA) FY 2009** are now available on line for all qualified applicants. MHAA funding supports both capital and non-capital programs/projects that enhances/supports/promotes heritage and cultural tourism activities in ATHA's 14 member communities. Eligible applicants include non-profit organizations, community groups, businesses and government agencies. Applicants can apply for up to \$50,000 for non-capital project grants and up to \$100,000 for capital project grants. FYI, in order to be eligible for a Capital Grant the project must be located in a Target Investment Zone (Laurel, Gateway Arts District, Berwyn Heights, College Park, Greenbelt, and Riverdale Park).

The MHAA grants are for projects slated to begin in FY 2009 (begins July 1, 2008). **Applicants wishing to apply for an MHAA grant must file an "Intent to Apply" form with ATHA by February 27, with the full application due on March 14, 2008. Please note that a 1:1 match is required for all grants. All applications will be reviewed by a committee representing the preservation, tourism and business sectors. The Intent to Apply form is attached.**

The full application for the project grants can be found on MHAA's website at www.marylandhistoricaltrust.net under "Forms and Documents." Please note that all applications must be submitted to ATHA, Inc for approval before submission to MHAA. MHAA will not accept independent applications. The completed application packages for those who have filed the "Intent to Apply" form will be due to the ATHA on March 15th. The MHAA awards for fiscal year 2009 will be announced in May 2008.

Federal Agencies Announce New Foreclosure Help

On February 12, Treasury Secretary Henry Paulson and HUD Secretary Alfonso Jackson announced that the HOPE NOW alliance, which is comprised of the nation's six largest

mortgage lenders, would join together in a new effort to reduce the number of home foreclosure across the nation. The new effort is called [Project Lifeline](#).

As part of this effort, the six lenders, Bank of America, Citigroup, Countrywide, Chase, Washington Mutual, and Wells Fargo, will reach out to "seriously delinquent homeowners" whose mortgages they hold and who face the greatest risk of losing their homes. [Foreclosure proceedings against homeowners who respond to the outreach will be "paused" for 30 days, during which time the homeowner and loan servicer will attempt to come up with a loan modification that allows the homeowner to keep their home. Although the lenders have committed to outreach, struggling homeowners do not have to wait for a call from the mortgage servicer. Homeowners can call their servicer directly and ask about Project Lifeline or call the national foreclosure helpline operated by the HOPE NOW alliance at 1-888-955-HOPE.](#)

[Stimulus Package Includes Help for the Housing Market](#)

Just in time for Valentine's Day, President Bush signed legislation to jump start the struggling U.S. economy by putting tax rebate checks ranging from \$300 - \$1,200 in the pockets of millions of Americans and providing incentives for businesses.

The \$168 billion economic stimulus package also included provisions to help the troubled housing market, a top National League of Cities legislative priority. The package raises temporarily the limit on Federal Housing Administration - insured loans from \$362,790 to \$729,750, as well as the limit on loans that Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac can purchase from \$417,000 to \$792,750. Changes in these limits are intended to ease the credit crunch in the market for "jumbo" mortgages, which are often necessary in high-cost housing markets. The crunch, fallout from the subprime mortgage collapse, has made it difficult, if not impossible for homebuyers in those markets to get new mortgages or refinance existing ones.

[As far as who will receive a rebate check](#), most people who earned at least \$3,000 in qualifying income during 2007, including through Social Security or veterans' disability benefits will receive a rebate of up to \$600 for individuals and \$1,200 for couples, with an additional \$300 for each child. Single individuals making more than \$75,000 and couples with income more than \$150,000 will get smaller checks, up to the top limits of \$87,000 for childless individuals or \$174,000 for couples. The seminar topics will include: the health effects of lead poisoning, sources of lead, the connections between lead and healthy homes, new laws and legal issues related to rental property owners, lead safe work practices and the roles of the Prince George's County Health Department and the Maryland Department of the Environment regarding children exposed to lead.

The target audience for this training includes Prince George's County homeowners, rental property owners, managers, maintenance personnel, child day-care providers, day care inspectors, public and private school's maintenance employees and nurses, housing inspectors and public health professionals.
