Municipal Elections Set for Office of Mayor, one council seat in Ward 1 and one council seat in Ward 2

The election will be held at City Hall, Monday, May 4, 2009 and the polls will be open 7:00 am to 8:00 pm on Election Day; the Candidate Filing Deadline Date is between 6:00pm and 8:00 pm April 6, 2009 (this is when the Supervisor of Elections will certify the names on the petitions turned in by each candidate).

The Candidate's Forum Night is scheduled for Thursday, April 23, 2009 at 6:30 pm at the Nature Center, located at 4701 31st Place, Mount Rainier, MD 20712.

Absentee Ballot Applications are available for pick-up at City Hall. Absentee Ballots will be available after April 6, 2009 once the candidates have been certified.

In order to be eligible for to vote in the City election, each person must meet the following requirements: a) is a citizen of the United States; b) is at least 18 years of age; c) is registered to vote in accordance with the provisions of the City charter; d) has resided in the corporate limits of the city for at least (30) days preceding City election; and e) has registered to vote at least 30 days prior to the election. Registration by the Prince George's Board of Elections shall be deemed the only registration for City elections.

Census Address Canvassing

The 2010 Decennial Census will be taking place nationwide beginning in March of 2010.

The goal of the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census, is to meet constitutional and legislative requirements to count and certify the population of the United States. The 2010 Decennial Census process is the largest peacetime operation in the United States. The data produced from the Decennial Census is used to reapportion the seats of the United States House of Representatives and realign the boundaries of the legislative districts in each state. The Census data is also used to allocate approximately \$300 billion dollars each year in federal financial assistance; and provide a social, demographic and economic profile of the nation's people. This profile will assist in guiding policy decisions at all levels of government.

Prior to the delivery of census questionnaires to residents in 2010, the Census Bureau will conduct local address canvassing from April to July 2009. This canvassing operation is designed to ensure that the address list for the Census is as accurate as possible and involves Census Bureau personnel visiting residential neighborhoods and updating lists and maps using hand-held computers.

This information is being disseminated to make residents aware that Census Bureau employees will be canvassing Mount Rainier neighborhoods starting this April. The address verification process *does not involve questioning residents*. No Census Bureau employee will come to your door in order to verify your address or ask you Census related questions. Anyone who comes to your door claiming to be a Census Bureau employee should be immediately reported to the Mount Rainier Police Department.

**CITY OF MOUNT RAINIER NOTICE OF
PROPOSED REAL PROPERTY TAX INCREASE**

The Mayor and City Council of the City of Mount Rainier, Maryland, proposes to increase real property taxes.

1. For the tax year beginning July 1, 2009, the estimated real property assessable base will increase by 13.3%, from \$346,280,038 to \$392,242,222.
2. If the City of Mount Rainier maintains the current tax rate of \$0.790 per \$100 of assessment, real property tax revenues will increase by 13.3% resulting in \$363,101 of new real property tax revenues.
3. In order to fully offset the effect of increasing assessments the real property tax rate should be reduced to \$0.697, the constant yield tax rate.
4. The City is considering not reducing its real property tax rate enough to fully offset increasing assessments. The City proposes to adopt a real property tax rate of \$0.790 per \$100 of assessment. This tax rate is 13.3% higher than the constant yield tax rate and will generate \$363,101 in additional property tax revenues.

A public hearing on the proposal real property tax rate increase will be held at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 21, 2009 in the City Council Chambers – Upper Level at Mount Rainier City Hall, One Municipal Place, Mount Rainier, MD 20712.

Rat Management

If you think you have rats in your neighborhood, there are steps you can take to help get rid of them. Rats need three things: food, water and harborage (shelter).

Poor sanitation and the presence of garbage allow rats to exist in residential areas. Good sanitation will effectively limit the number of rats that can survive in and around the home. This involves good housekeeping, proper storage and handling of food materials and refuse, and elimination of rodent harborage. Remove piles of wood and debris. Rats will find food and water from bird feeders, fountains and ponds, uncovered trash cans; food scraps dropped along the sidewalk, pet droppings, pet food dishes, open restaurant grease drums, and exposed plastic or paper garbage bags. The most successful form of rat control is to "build them out" by making their access to structures impossible. All places where food is stored, processed or used should be rodent-proof. Store bulk foods, bird seed, and dry pet foods in metal trash cans or similar containers. Seal any building openings larger than 1/4 inch to exclude both rats and mice.

Trapping is an effective method of control. It is the preferred method in homes, garages, and other structures where only a few rats are present. Poison baits can be used to treat major infestations. It is recommended that you hire a professional exterminator if you are planning to use rodenticides.

Please make every effort to ensure that your property is kept clear of all trash, animal defecation, and wood piles. This is a great home for rats. Rats will live within 100 feet of a food source, so if you remove their food source, they will move on.

How to Deal with the Mosquito Population

With summer here so is the all too familiar nuisance of mosquitos. Mosquito's can be transmitters of encephalitis, malaria, and yellow fever to humans, and heartworm to pets. Please clear your property of any potential breeding sites for mosquitoes. You can take steps to reduce this menace right at home, since many generations of mosquitoes can breed right in your own yard.

- Get rid of old tires, tin cans, buckets, drums, bottles, or and water holding containers.
- Fill in or drain any low places (puddles, ruts) in yard
- Keep drains, ditches, and culverts clean of weeds and trash so water will drain properly
- Cover trash containers to keep out rain water
- Repair leaky pipes and outside faucets
- Empty plastic wading pool at least once a week and store it indoors when not in use
- Make sure your backyard pool is properly cared for while on vacation
- Fill in tree rot holes and hollow stumps that hold water with sand or concrete
- Change the water in bird baths and plant pots or drip trays at least once a week
- Keep grass cut short and shrubbery well trimmed around the house so adult mosquitoes will not hide there

NOISE RESTRICTIONS

The City Code restricts the amount of noise that can be made during daytime and night-time hours. Owners or operators of residential multi-family dwellings may enforce more restrictive noise regulations on their own properties. Below is a short synopsis. Check the full text of the noise restrictions in the Code at Sec. 10-121 (available on the City website, www.mountrainiermd.org).

Nighttime Noise: During nighttime hours (8:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. from Sunday through Friday and 10:00 p.m. on Saturday to 8:00 a.m. on Sunday), if the noise is audible more than 50 feet from the private property where such noise is occurring or more than 50 feet from the noise source on public property, then there is a presumption that the noise is unreasonable and that a public nuisance exists. Unreasonable night-time noises includes, noise from amplified sources like radios, the operation or use of any tool or equipment (including but not limited to construction equipment, lawnmowers, power tools, hammers, drills, and generators), yelling, and barking dogs.
