Ivy's Ward 2 Report

Happy 100th Anniversary Mount Rainier! It's been a busy and invigorating first year for me on the Mount Rainier City Council. By the time you read this the City Council will have completed the 2011 Budget process. The City is fortunate that due to the efforts of our staff the City is able to continue all current staffing levels for all departments, especially the City's Police Department. While the City did have to use some reserve funds to balance the budget, the most important factor is that those funds were available. Council and staff are continuing efforts to find ways to partner with outside entities to provide the resources necessary to meet community needs.

Economically, this past year has been very challenging for our local businesses. During the winter storms of 2010 the City lost THREE businesses. Fortunately, the City is gaining SPOTLIGHT Café, Fountain Framing and Joe's Movement Emporium both continue to grow. We, as a community, must remember that our businesses are our neighbors too and they need our support as well. Council has advanced a number of new initiatives to support local businesses, such as the Small Business Forum held at Joe's Movement Emporium in April, the Family Movie Nights at 33rd & Perry Streets, marketing development opportunities in the City, acquiring the former funeral home property, located at the corner of Eastern and Rhode Island Avenues and the Easter Star Building located on Rhode Island Avenue.

Partnerships continue to remain a cornerstone of the City's accomplishments. Council, with support from staff, continues to work with the principals from both Mount Rainier and Thomas Stone elementary schools, the Mount Rainier Business Association, Joe's Movement Emporium, Gateway Community Development Corporation, Anacostia Trails Heritage Association, Housing Initiatives Partnership, neighboring jurisdictions and a host of federal, state and county elected officials to ensure that the Prince George's County Arts District communities are well positioned to continue grow and prosper.

My goals for this year include working with the local schools and the Mount Rainier Library, supporting the retaining and recruitment of businesses, continuing community building activities and events, forwarding redevelopment efforts along Rhode Island Avenue, and supporting the newly established Mount Rainier Community Fund.

What I have learned, in my first year, is that this City Council is committed individually and collectively united in their desire to advance the needs of the City, its businesses and its residents? And like many Cities, we need help from our residents. Volunteer for a committee or help plant a tree. As we continue to celebrate 100 years as a City, let's remember that one of the unique qualities of Mount Rainier residents is that we "Bring out the 'neighbor' in neighborhood!"

Item 2: Mount Rainier Community Fund (MRCF)

In honor of the City's Centennial Anniversary the Council is working with private citizens to establish the Mount Rainier Community Fund, an advised fund within the Community Foundation of Prince's George's County, a subsidiary of the Community Foundation of the National Capital Region, Incorporated. The mission of the Mount Rainier Community Fund is to promote, improve, and enrich the quality life of residents in the City of Mount Rainier. The Mount Rainier Community Fund will raise private dollars to support activities and programs serving the residents, businesses and organizations of Mount Rainier, Maryland.

The Mount Rainier Community Fund will promote cooperative endeavors and undertakes projects that celebrate, respect, and build upon the legacy and ideals of the City of Mount Rainier: citizen involvement; collaborative self-sufficiency; community building and participation. Our goal is to raise funds and make

grants that advance the social, environmental, economic, educational and cultural interests that promote and facilitate a distinct and lively community. The Mount Rainier Farmers Market is a producer only market which offers farm grown fruits and vegetables from farms in Maryland, Pennsylvania and Virginia. The idea of an producer only market is critical for this market-we want to provide economic support for local farmers in the Chesapeake area. Our vendors grow and/or make everything they sell during their natural season! You will not see cantaloupes at our market in June or pineapples at any table!

Each week, vendors will offer seasonal produce and goods -fresh fruit .vegetables, eggs, flowers, honey, meats and baked goods. Some of our vendors are certified organic, some use organic practices to grow their produce and some use conventional farming practices. All of our farmers use methods which are safe not only for their customers, but for themselves and their farm workers.

An ongoing feature of the market will be the "Chef at Market" demonstrations. Opening Day will feature Carla Hall, former Top Chef Contestant, Owner of Alchemy Caterers and now Mount Rainier Farmers Market vendor.

We encourage you to talk with the farmers and other vendors. Many have great recipes for their products as well as tips on growing your own garden. Get to know the person that helps keep you and your family healthy. We hope to see you there!

MESSAGE FROM MICHAEL E. SCOTT, CHIEF OF POLICE

Preventing Thefts from Auto

During the first three months of 2010 the Department has seen a significant increase in the number of thefts from motor vehicles here in Mount Rainier. These thefts have also been on the rise in our neighboring jurisdictions. Most troubling are the thefts from vehicles whose drivers are purchasing fuel at our local BP station on Eastern Avenue. These thefts are strictly crimes of opportunity and thieves are successful when owners forget to take basic precautions or become distracted as they go about their daily routines. It is very important that you take steps to minimize your risk of becoming the victim of a theft from auto. It's your stuff! Protect it by taking away a thief's opportunity. Here are some handy tips that can help you do just that!

- The best way to prevent theft from your auto is to always keep valuables out of sight. Never leave cell phones, briefcases, suitcases, GPS units, or small electronic devices (personal music devices, digital assistants, etc.) in your car in plain view. Take these items with you, or secure them — all the time, every time!
- If your car has a trunk, use it. Put valuables in there or in a locked glove compartment. Hiding items under seats is better than leaving them in plain view, but securing them inside the glove compartment or trunk is a far better deterrent.
- Any time you're shopping, place packages in the trunk, not on the passenger seats or floors.
- Look for car radios or other sound systems that can operate only in the vehicle in which it was originally installed. This reduces the risk of theft.
- If you can unfasten your sound system and take it with you, or lock it in your trunk, do so. And don't forget to do the same with your CDs and tapes.
- Always lock your doors even if you plan to be away from your vehicle for only a minute such as running in to pay for gas.
- If you don't have the luxury of parking your vehicle in a garage at night and have to leave it parked in the driveway or on the street in front of the house, makes sure to remove the garage door opener. This is a key to your home!!
- Wheel and tire thieves usually work as a team, much like a NASCAR pit crew. They can have your wheels and be gone in just a couple of minutes! If you have spent a small fortune on custom wheels and Z rated low profile tires, make sure you use a tamper proof wheel lock to secure each wheel to the vehicle. Do not leave the wheel lock key inside the vehicle – take it with you and keep it in a safe place. If your wheels didn't come with security locks, you can purchase them at most automobile parts supply stores. They are inexpensive insurance against losing your investment to thieves.
- The best advice is to not leave anything in your vehicle, or at least in plain sight, that you would not want taken. Even the smallest most insignificant items, even a small amount of change in a center console, left in plain view could result in a window being smashed and the item(s) stolen. If you eliminate the opportunity, you have a greater chance of eliminating the crime.
