CITY OF MOUNT RAINIER SEEKS DEVELOPMENT CONSULTANT

The City of Mount Rainier is seeking consultant with commercial mixed use development experience to assist the City with marketing city owned property in a designated arts and entertainment district on Route 1, Mount Rainier, Prince George’s County, MD as an urban renewal project. The consultant will also be required to assist the city with writing a Request for Proposal (RFP) for the purpose of soliciting bids for development. Consultant Deliverables

The consultant hired for this project will be required to develop the criteria for an RFP requesting experienced developers to present qualifications with detailed background of similar successful commercial development projects.

The consultant will advise the city in the final project scope for the RFP. The scope may include one or all of the following development areas:

1. Development of city-owned property located at 3701 Eastern Avenue, 3200 Rhode Island Avenue, and 3206-3208 Rhode Island Avenue, Mount Rainier, MD
2. Development of city-owned property at 3701 Eastern Avenue, 3200 Rhode Island Avenue, 3206-3208 Rhode Island Avenue, and privately owned property located at 3210 Rhode Island Avenue
3. Development of privately owned property located at 3300 Rhode Island Avenue, Mount Rainier, MD
4. Development of privately owned property located at 3308, 3310, Rhode Island Avenue, Mount Rainier, MD

The consultant will write the RFP, publicize the RFP, accept responses to the RFP, evaluate the RFPs, and represent the city with a score and written evaluation for the four highest scoring RFPs.

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New Route 1 Bus Service

On February 18th, Council Members Eric Olson, Will Campos, and Tom Dernoga were pleased to announce that Price Georges County now has bus service dedicated to the Route One corridor.

The bus service runs between Mount Rainier, at the District line, to Ikea in College Park, making thirty-five stops along the way.

This dedicated line of bus service will increase the connectivity of the communities and businesses located along the corridor as well as the University of Maryland. The availability of this option should also lessen vehicular traffic on Route One and support economic revitalization.

Over time, informational material for the route will be branded to

reflect the ubiquitous symbol of Route One as a way to further define and promote this service. In the meantime, the bus service has begun to operate and more

An OPEN LETTER to the Residents of Mount Rainier Maryland

Are you up for the "Take 10" challenge?

On behalf of the U.S. Census Bureau, and the residents of Mount Rainier, I am challenging each of you to join me in making history by helping me to get every man, woman and child counted in MOUNT RAINIER by completing and mailing back the 2010 Census questionnaire during the 2010 Census.

During each Decennial Census, the Census Bureau undertakes the count of every person residing in the United States, as mandated by Article 1, Section 2 of the U.S. Constitution. To encourage everyone to take 10 minutes to answer the 10 simple questions on the 2010 Census form, the Census Bureau has launched the "Take 10" campaign. The "Take 10" Challenge - Tools to Inspire the Mail Back Participation Rates for the 2010 Census

During the 2000 Census, 72 percent of occupied households mailed back their forms. In 2010, the Census Bureau is challenging communities to do even better. As the Mayor of Mount Rainier, I am challenging you to help me make sure that every resident in Mount Rainier is counted. The Census Bureau's "Take 10" campaign offers a wide range of tools for our community to meet this challenge. These include:

* Suggestions on how to use friendly competition with other communities to inspire your community to participate in the census.

As a resident of Mount Rainier, you play an important role in making sure we can the dollars we need to continue revitalizing our community. You can also make sure that your neighbors complete mail back their

forms. The 2010 Census questionnaires will be delivered from March 15-17, 2010. From the time the forms are delivered until the closing of the mail campaign at the end of April, you have the opportunity to complete and mail this importance document back to the Census Bureau. I believe that you can do this and the you can and will encourage your neighbors to also complete and return their census form.

The stakes are high; an accurate count of our population helps to ensure that our municipality receives its fair share of federal funding that will be allocated based on our population. This funding includes resources for services, such as health care, education, and roads.

You must complete and mail back your census forms between March 15, 2010 and April 15, 2010. The good news is that the 2010 Census questionnaire is one of the shortest in history-just 10 questions that only take about 10 minutes to complete. I hope the CITY OF MOUNT RAINIER can count on you to complete and return your census questionnaire, and to encourage your neighbors to participate in the 2010 Census.

Speed Camera Location

The City has installed a speed camera on Arundel Road between 32nd Street and 34th Street. This camera will assist the police department in enforcing the 25 mph speed limit east and westbound on Arundel Road. The camera is operational from 6 a.m. until 8 p.m. Monday through Friday. Since January the 18th this camera has recorded 877 speed violations. The highest speed recorded so far is 80 MPH! You read it right. Eighty miles per hour on a residential street at 4:30 in the afternoon!
