## City Manager Report

---

### **CDBG Street Improvements**

The City has been working on several matters of importance to the citizenry. One project involves the replacement and/or installation of curbs on gutters on many of the City's streets and as well as driveway aprons as a result of funding through the County's Community Development and Block Grant program (CDBG). Please note that the repair work was not done on every driveway due to limited funding. Only those aprons considered to be in dire need of repair were replaced. Other areas not addressed will be considered during the repair phase for program year 32 during the summer months later this year. City management is working on finalizing the re-striping of 34<sup>th</sup> Street.

Of particular concern was the drainage problem experienced by the residents on Tilden Street. The work that was completed here appears to be satisfactory to those residents thus far. City Manager Wallace has requested additional assistance from Prince George's County to address the drainage issues in other areas of the City. Assistant Manager James Booth has worked diligently with the City Engineer Consultant to determine the best approach to resolving the drainage problems.

### **Grant Funding**

The Mayor and Council are pursuing a partnership with the Town of Brentwood for shared community policing services. This partnership is geared towards the enhancement of police services for both the Town of Brentwood and the City of Mount Rainier. Prince George's County has awarded a grant of \$90,000 to support this effort.

The City has received notice of other funding from the State of Maryland Community Development Administration through the Community Legacy program in the amount of \$85,000. This grant will be used towards the predevelopment

(architectural design and engineering study) for the construction of a community center at 3409 Rhode Island Avenue (the site of the current library and Congressman Chris Van Hollen's satellite office). The City has also been informed that it will receive \$150,000 for this effort as well through a County sponsored Bond Bill supported by Senator Gwendolyn Britt.

The City has also been promised 15 slots through the Prince George's County Summer Youth Program Initiative. All 15 applications have been issued to Mount Rainier residents. Thus far, two Mount Rainier businesses – Nisey's Boutique and Artsmosphere Café have agreed to train youth during the summer. Prince George's County will pay the salary for the hiring of the youth participants who will work for the departments of public works, police, and city hall.

The City has also learned that it will receive \$100,000 for street repairs under CDBG for next year.

The City is also moving towards finalizing the upgrade of lighting and decorative improvements for 34<sup>th</sup> Street through a grant from community legacy last year. Once the City has received final cost estimates on the installation of decorative lighting, the project will be underway.

### **Trash Code Violations**

The City is still experiencing problems with residents adhering to the City's trash code. Please keep in mind that the regulations are for the safety and health of the community, to control the rodent population, to help with keeping the City clean, and to improve the overall appearance of the City. All trash is to be kept in air tight containers with lids. Non-contaminated cardboard material is to be placed out with recyclables on Friday of each week. Please remember to return trash receptacles to the side or rear of your property once trash has been collected. Prompt return of trash receptacles helps to

improve the appearance and also helps to ensure that your trash cans and lids remain in good condition. The Public Works Department has been instructed to place all lids inside the trash can to help with containing the lids to each can. Let's continue to work together for a better Mount Rainier!

## City of Mount Rainier Gets Tough on Code Enforcement

The City's Code Enforcement Department recently received training from the State's Attorney Office concerning the coordination of Court cases for blighted and vacant properties within the City. Following the frustration experienced by Code Enforcement when cases are prosecuted in District Court of Prince George's County, the City Manager requested the State's Attorney office to help the City with an improved process for successful judgments against property owners who do not maintain their property in accordance with City of Mount Rainier Codes. The results – the Department of Environmental Resources has recently successfully prosecuted cases where the property owner has been negligent. Additionally, property owners have received hefty fines for failure to abate code violations.

Mayor Malinda Miles and City Manager Jeannelle Wallace along with members of the staff including Acting Chief Michael Scott, and Acting Lieutenant James Stoots, met with the 47th delegation - Delegates Doyle Niemann and Victor Ramirez, Senator Gwendolyn Britt, and County Councilman Will Campos to discuss the possibility of partnering with other small municipalities to offer better and less costly health insurance benefits to its employees. Also in attendance at the meeting were Obie Pinckney, Municipal Liaison to Jack Johnson; Anna Angolia, Chair of the Commissioners for the Town of Cottage City; Joyce Frederick representing Mayor Dianna Fennell of Colmar Manor; Julie Sanden, Benefits Coordinator for Prince George's County; and Robert Friedman of Congressman Chris Van Hollen's Office

A follow-up meeting is scheduled for May 18, 2006, 8:30 a.m. at City Hall.

## Council Highlights

April 4, 2006—Mayor and Council Meeting

- Ordinance 7-2006—this Ordinance amends Chapter 12B, Urban Forest, of the *Mount Rainier Code* relating to hazardous trees on private property. The new language follows:

### Section 12B-8. Hazardous Trees on Private Property.

A. No person shall permit a tree or tree part, dead or alive (including a stump displaced from the ground), to stand on private property if it is hazardous. Hazardous, in relation to a tree or tree part, means defective, diseased or dead, and posing an unreasonable risk of failure or fracture with the potential to cause injury to people or damage to property.

B. No person shall maintain a fallen tree, tree part, brushwood, or firewood on private property that constitutes a harborage place for rodents, vermin or other pests.

C. When a violation of this section is found on private property in the City, the City Manager (or designee) shall give notice to the owner, occupant, or person responsible for the property to correct the condition within such reasonable time as may be specified in the notice.

D. If any person, after receipt of notice pursuant to subsection C, fails or refuses to correct or abate a violation, and the City finds that immediate action is needed to protect the public health, safety or property, then the City may take any action reasonably necessary to abate or correct the condition or may contract to have the necessary action taken. The City shall send the property owner or his or her agent a bill for the costs of the corrective action. If the bill is not paid within 30 calendar days, the cost shall be a lien against the real property which may be collected and enforced in the same manner as are property taxes or by a suit against the owner.

A violation of this Chapter is a municipal infraction with a fine of \$200

April 11, 2004—Mayor and Council Work Session

- Acting Chief Michal Scott presented the Fiscal Year 2007 Budget for the Mount Rainier Police Department. Capital requests included radar equipment, motor segway, marked and unmarked police vehicles. Emphasis during fiscal year 2007 will be on traffic enforcement, drug activity, and public safety.
- Ordinance 8-2006—(First Reading) amending Chapter 3, Building Code of the *Mount Rainier Code* to add a requirement for a City building permit prior to the demolition of a building or structure. **A City building permit is required** for every construction, enlargement, permanent paving, removal or demolition with the City requires a permit from the Department of Environmental Resources of Prince George's County and a permit from the City of Mount Rainier.
- For demolition or removal of a building or structure with a footprint of more than 500 square feet, the charge for a building permit shall be \$500.00.
- The Mayor and Council also discussed the pros and cons of annexation and received an update from Greg Hall of County Council member Will Campos office.
- Discussion also focused on the Maryland—National Capital Park and Planning Commission's prior presentation on the proposed upgrades for the 30<sup>th</sup> Street Park. **A public hearing is scheduled at City Hall for May 23, 2006 to hear comments from the citizenry.**

April 25, 2006—Special Meeting of the Mayor and Council

- Discussion focused on the proposed Memorandum of Understanding with the Town of Brentwood for shared Community Policing Services with the City of Mount Rainier. Vote for approval was scheduled for May 2, 2006.

### The Motor Scooter Boogie

If you haven't heard that annoying, high pitched whine of a miniature motor scooter riding through, over and around your neighborhood, consider yourself one of the lucky ones!

What started out as the "motorized pedacycle" or MOPED back in the gas crunched days of the 1970s has evolved into today's modern "motor scooter." Today's motor scooters look much more like motorcycles than Mopeds, and have "tweaked" motors that allow them to travel a little faster than their predecessors, while staying in the "under 50 cc" engine size category. The average moped could only get up to speeds of about 25 MPH, while the average motor scooter can attain steady speeds in the 40 MPH range. Most of today's motor scooters have a sleek, European styling about them, although there are some which are built to look like "race rocket" motorcycles, and even some that resemble miniature Harleys.

It's these smaller, "race rocket" or "pocket rocket" type motor scooters that cause problems for our residents. You know the ones I'm talking about. They look like a full size motorcycle that someone shrunk in the dryer like an old t-shirt and appear not much bigger than your average cocker spaniel! Small and difficult to see, these scooters pose a hazard to pedestrians and street traffic, and their riders often fail to heed the rules of the road – and sidewalks. In short, they are a nuisance!

The popularity of these motorized scooters has taken off over the past few years. They often top the Christmas and birthday lists of children, teenagers and adults. Parents buy them for their kids because they think it will be a fun toy, but in an urban environment such as ours, they are anything but a "toy." They are potentially dangerous motor vehicles, and as such, children younger than 16 have no business riding one on our streets and sidewalks.

Maryland law requires that riders have either a driver's license or a moped license for good reason. *Training.* Driver training teaches teens not only the laws and rules of the road, but they get some experience in actually doing it. They have to demonstrate a minimum amount of proficiency. Children on the other hand often just jump on one of these "pocket rockets" and ride at full speed, darting in and out of traffic, riding on the sidewalks, without a clue as to the real dangers they face. Since motorists do not easily see them, and because the rider is inexperienced, these kids pose a hazard to themselves, to motorists and to pedestrians. According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission 5,900 emergency room injuries were attributed to motorized scooters in 2002.

If you see anyone who you think is using any type of motor scooter illegally, please call the police department and report it. Try and get a description of the rider, including what he/she is wearing, and a description of the scooter. It is not uncommon for neighborhood kids to share one of these scooters, so you may see different people riding the same one. If you know, or have an idea where the rider lives, let us know so we can contact the owner of the scooter or a parent.

If you are a parent whose child has one of these, please know that we are serious about keeping them off our streets. If you want to let your child have that motorcycle or motorcross experience, please find an

appropriate training facility, school or private instructor that has the proper space for them to ride. The streets, sidewalks and parks in Mount Rainier *are not* that proper space.

#### REMEMBER - MARYLAND STREET LEGAL MOTOR SCOOTERS:

1. Must have a seat for the driver,
2. Must have a "step-thru" chassis,
3. Must have an engine size of 50cc or less,
4. Must have an automatic transmission,
5. Must have a white headlight in the front, and a red reflector or light to the rear,
6. May not travel at speeds in excess of 30 MPH,
7. May not travel on roadways whose posted maximum speed limit is more than 50 MPH,
8. Must use bike lanes or paved shoulders when on the highway except for passing, and
9. May not use bike or pedestrian paths.
10. The driver must possess a valid driver's license (any class) or a Moped license. Tags and insurance are not required, nor is a helmet required for anyone over the age of 16. Insurance and a DOT approved helmet are recommended.
11. The use of mopeds and motor scooters on private property, such as parking lots and open fields, are subject to the permissions and rules granted by the owners of the property. Riding on private property without the permission of the owner could result in an arrest for trespassing!

## Wheels on the Circle. . .The Mount Rainier Bicycle Co-op is Open for Business!

---

It's springtime, and thoughts turn to outdoor activities. But what if one of those activities involves bicycling, and the only action your bike has seen this past winter has been from the inside of your garage?

Getting it (and you) back in shape for bicycling has just been made a little easier—You've got the **Mount Rainier Bicycle Co-op** to help get you and your wheels get back on the trail! What was once a garage for local law enforcement has since become housing for the newly-formed Mount Rainier Bicycle Co-op (MRBC). Since its inception in the fall of 2005, and with invaluable assistance from Trip for Kids/Metro DC (TFK), the all-volunteer Co-op is a one-stop shop for local residents to perform basic maintenance and repairs on their bikes. For novices, we offer basic "How-To's" on keeping bikes up and rolling. MRBC also sponsor bike rides, including rides designed for children and teens that include mechanical training, safety do's and don'ts, and nutrition education. And you should know that MRBC's efforts have not gone unnoticed—Mount Rainier City Manager Jeanelle Wallace received word last month that the City has received a Maryland Municipal League Award of Excellence on behalf of the MRBC, recognizing the co-op's efforts to make Mount Rainier one of Maryland's "excellent municipalities." Not bad for an organization that's barely six months old!

Playing a major role in the MRBC's success is *Trips For Kids/Metro DC*, a local non-profit organization that is recognized as one of the finest small non-profits in the DC area for their mentoring and physical activity program tailored especially for children (Find out more on the web: [www.tfkmetrodc.org](http://www.tfkmetrodc.org)). TFK provided bikes, tools, sponsorship, insurance, and management expertise to get the co-op up and running which, in turn, gave TFK an opportunity to expand its successful

program into P.G. County. Out of this partnership comes a win-win-win situation: Mount Rainier residents get a bike repair facility; TFK gets a stake in P.G. County and a place to hang their hats (or "helmets"); and area children have another outlet for physical activity, and an opportunity to learn

the do's-and-don'ts of bicycling. All three facets of this partnership were first put into play last March as MRBC and TFK sponsored a bike hike along the Northwest Branch Trail, a family-oriented event that featured kids and their parents on an easy-

going ride and picnic along the nearby Northwest Branch Hiker/Biker Trail.

Since the announcement of the Maryland Municipal League award, the co-op has been busy on a number of fronts:

- On April 17, 17 children from the Sursum Corda housing project in D.C. visited the co-op through arrangements made by co-op president (and founder) PJ Parks. They learned that bicycling is healthy, practical, and good for the earth, as well as the importance of wearing a helmet and having a bike lock. They also learned how to patch an inner tube, successfully predicting that there would be bubbles in the bucket of water at the location of the tiny hole in the tube! Each child was fitted with a helmet and rode a bike up and down the alley, and they each want to return to the next TFK/MRBC co-sponsored bike hike.
- The Co-op will participate in MountRainier Day activities on May 20<sup>th</sup>, including fielding a team of bicyclists of all ages in the parade, hosting a bike rodeo, and raffling off a BMX bike to generate funding and promote cycling.
- The MountRainier Business Association has committed \$500 for T-shirts that will be given to children who participate in the bike parade.

The Co-op is located just off the downtown traffic circle at 3409 Rhode Island Avenue, behind City Hall (just enter from the alley between the bus terminal and the library, and look for the garage). Our hours of operation are 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., Saturdays. And joining couldn't be easier – just fill out our membership and liability forms and pay a \$5.00 per family fee that is good for a six month renewable term. With the community's support, Mount Rainier and the surrounding Port Town communities can have a first-class repair shop with expanded hours that could be staffed by adults and teens who could earn a rebuilt bicycle through their volunteer efforts. This type of "recyclery" has been successful in D.C., New York, California, and a number of college campuses (just Google "bike co-op"). If they can pedal it, so can we!

### CITY OF MOUNT RAINIER NOTICE OF PROPOSED REAL PROPERTY TAX INCREASE

The Mayor and City Council of the City of Mount Rainier, Maryland, proposes to increase real property taxes

1. For the tax year beginning July 1, 2006, the estimated real property assessable base will increase by 8.8 %, from \$237,315,491 to \$258,239,213
2. If the City of Mount Rainier maintains the current tax rate of \$.790 per \$100 of assessment, real property tax revenues will increase by 8.8 % resulting in \$165,297 of new real property tax revenues.
3. In order to fully offset the effect of increasing assessments, the real property tax rate should be reduced to \$0.726, the constant yield tax rate.
4. The City is considering not reducing its real property tax rate enough to fully offset increasing assessments. The City proposes to adopt a real property tax rate of \$.790 per \$100 of assessment. This tax rate is 8.8 % higher than the constant yield tax rate and will generate \$165,297 in additional property tax revenues.

A public hearing on the proposed real Property tax rate increase will be held at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 23, 2006 in the City Council Chambers – Upper Level at Mount Rainier City Hall, One Municipal Place, Mount Rainier, MD

The hearing is open to the public, and public testimony is encouraged.
