At the time of application, applicant must provide copies of a valid deed, driver's license, vehicle registration, utility bill, or lease for City Records.

If a parking pass is lost or stolen, the owner must make a report to the Police Department. Only then will a replacement be issued.

Residential Parking District

A Residential Parking Permit (hereinafter referred to as RPP) is generated by the city, per the terms of the ordinance, for the purpose of controlling parking on a given designated block within the city. The permit is subject to the following terms:

1. Each RPP is associated with a particular dwelling unit
2. The RPP designates a right to park on a particular block, but does not guarantee parking on said block to permit holder. (For example, more permits could be issued than there are spaces on the block.
3. A maximum of two (2) PRRs and one (1) VP shall be generally available to each dwelling unit.
4. The fee for one car is \$20.00. The fee for two cars is \$40.00. The fee for one visitor's permit is \$10.00.

An application form is available at City Hall. Applicants must demonstrate residency in the parking district and verification that the resident is the principal driver of the vehicle in a manner determined by the City Manager, which may include but is not limited to: utility bills, lease, driver's license, vehicle registration, deed, etc.

The Vehicle must display current, valid Maryland license plates. No permit shall be issued for a vehicle with an unpaid parking or other traffic citation. The provisions of this parking district shall not supersede Mount Rainier and the state law related to parking for persons with disabilities.

Vehicles are specifically exempted if they are owned or operated by a utility performing repair or other work for a utility; federal, state or local vehicle being used in the course of official government business; an authorized emergency vehicle, or a vehicle owned by active duty military personnel with legal residence in a state other than Maryland.
