A Resolution to Support the Prince George's County Municipal Collaboration FY 2017 MEA EmPOWER LMI Communities Grant Application and DHCD Sustainable Communities-Community Legacy Grant Applications

A Resolution of the City of Mount Rainier to approve the designation of a Municipal Collaboration application and receipt of financing for the MEA and DHCD Sustainable Communities-Community Legacy Projects further described in the MEA EmPOWER and Community Legacy Application, to be financed either directly by the Maryland Energy Administration, Department of Housing and Community Development (the "Department") of the State of Maryland or through other departments or agencies of the State of Maryland.

WHEREAS, The Municipal Collaboration consists of the Towns of Bladensburg, Brentwood, Capital Heights, Colmar Manor, Cottage City, Edmonston, Forest Heights, Glenarden, Landover Hills, Morningside, Mount Rainier, North Brentwood, Seat Pleasant, City of Bowie, City of Laurel, Town of Cheverly, City of Greenbelt, University Park and Prince George's County;

WHEREAS, The Municipal Collaboration has formed to successfully pursue and obtain grants funding that is used to reinvest in communities such as the Maryland Energy Administration, MEA Empower Clean Energy Communities Grant program (\$2,715,000.00), DHCD Community Legacy program (\$515,000.00) and obtained over \$1 million dollars, in U.S. Department of Energy funding, (EECBG) through Prince George's County, Maryland, installing solar retrofits on nine municipal complexes with result of all monies used and no findings on any audit;

WHEREAS, The Municipal Collaboration recognizes that there is a significant need for reinvestment and revitalization of the communities in the Municipal Collaboration; and,

WHEREAS, The Municipal Collaboration proposes to operate within Special Conditions set forth by MEA EmPOWER LMI Communities, grant conditions, and,

WHEREAS, the Municipal Collaboration proposes to operate only in authorized designate areas within the boundaries of the Municipal Collaboration, and/or as defined and approved by DHCD as a Sustainable Community-Community Legacy Area and to develop Community Legacy Projects in the Area(s), the purpose of which will be to contribute to the reinvestment and revitalization in the Area(s); and,

WHEREAS, the Department, either through Community Legacy or through other programs of the Department, or in cooperation with other State departments or agencies, may provide some or all of

the financing for the Projects (the "Project Financing") in order to assist in making it financially feasible; and

WHEREAS, in respect to DHCD, the Area is located within a priority funding area under Section 5-7B-02 of the Smart Growth Act and the Project will conform to the local zoning code; and


WHEREAS, the applicable law and regulations require approval of the Community Legacy Area designation, the Project, and the Project financing by the Town of Bladensburg as lead agency for the Municipal Collaboration and, where appropriate, by the chief elected executive official of the local subdivision;


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the **City of Mount Rainier** hereby endorses the designation of the Community Legacy Area and the Projects in the Area; and, HEREBY approves the request in the form of a grant, loan, or other financial vehicle; and



A Resolution Setting the Proposed Budget Calendar for the Fiscal Year 2018 Budget

WHEREAS, the Council must adopt a budget of City revenues and expenditures for Fiscal Year 2018, beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the budget shall provide a complete financial plan for the upcoming fiscal year and include estimates of anticipated revenues and proposed expenditures; and

WHEREAS, Charter section 702 provides that a budget for the next fiscal year shall be submitted to the Mayor and Council no later than March 31st of each year; and

WHEREAS, the deadline for the Council to adopt a City budget for Fiscal Year 2018 is June 30, 2017, but the Prince George’s County administrative deadline for preparing property tax bills is approximately June 9, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the budget process is a lengthy one; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to inform the public about the proposed budget, hold a public hearing on the proposed budget, and allow for citizen review and comment before final adoption of the budget ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNT RAINIER, MARYLAND:

1. The following calendar of events is adopted for the preparation and adoption of the City of Mount Rainier Budget for Fiscal Year (“FY”) 2018:



Friday, January 6, 2017	Budget instructions issued to all City Departments and Community Groups (including Bunker Hill Fire Department).
Friday, February 3, 2017	Deadline for all City Departments and Community Groups (including Bunker Hill

	Fire Department) to submit Budget FY 2018 requests to City Manager.
Monday, March 6, 2017	City Manager submits Proposed Budget FY 2018 to the Council.
Tuesday, March 7, 2017	City Manager presents Proposed Budget FY 2018 to the Council. Council holds work session on proposed Budget FY 2018 and discussion of Constant Yield Tax Rate.
Thursday, April 6, 2017	Notice published in Prince George's Post and/or Sentinel of Public Hearing on Proposed FY 2018 Budget and on Constant Yield Tax Rate (if necessary) scheduled for April 18, 2017.
Tuesday, April 11, 2017	The Council Meeting - Special work session on Budget FY 2018.
Tuesday, April 18, 2017	Public Hearing and Public Comment on Proposed Budget FY 2018 and Constant Yield Tax Rate; Special Meeting for First Reading on Budget FY 2018.
Tuesday, May 2, 2017	The Council Meeting; Second Reading and Vote on Budget FY 2018, Constant Yield Tax Rate (if necessary), and Tax Rate.


2. The Budget Calendar for the preparation and adoption of the City of Mount Rainier FY 2018 Budget may be amended or adjusted by the Council as necessary.




