**CITY OF MOUNT RAINIER, MARYLAND  
RESOLUTION 8-2016**

Introduced by Councilmember Bryan Knedler

**A resolution declaring that City-owned personal property consisting of four vehicles not needed by the City of Mount Rainier for public use; and, providing for the City to dispose of the vehicles at public auction, sale or scrap as determined by the Chief of Police.**

**WHEREAS**, the City owns the following motor vehicles:

A 2007 Chevrolet Trailblazer; Vehicle Identification Number 1GNET13MX72121383; known as Vehicle 70.

A 2007 Dodge Charger 4-door sedan; Vehicle Identification Number 2B3K43G77H669072; known as Vehicle 72.

A 2008 Dodge Charger 4-door sedan; Vehicle Identification Number B3LA43G38H156567; known as Vehicle 76.

A 1995 Jeep Cherokee; Vehicle Identification Number 1J4FJ68S35SLG32437; known as vehicle 88.

**WHEREAS**, these vehicles are beyond repair and thus have no operational value to the City.


**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and City Council of Mount Rainier, Maryland, that the vehicles are not needed by the City for public use, are declared surplus, and shall be disposed of by public auction, sale or scrap, or whichever is the best means as determined by the Chief of Police; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT** the City shall give not less than 20 days public notice that the vehicles have been declared surplus and the means of giving public notice shall include posting notices at City Hall, One Municipal Place Mount Rainier, Maryland 20712; and at the Mount Rainier Police Department located at 3249 Rhode Island Avenue Mount Rainier, Maryland 20712.


