A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE A PROJECT TO

Provide afterschool tutoring and enrichment to children in the Queens Manor Apartments, and information and referral and family literacy programs to their families through the HIP Kids and Families Program. This resolution supports the application of HIP Services Inc., a nonprofit organization certified by the Secretary of State of Maryland, to the State of Maryland to obtain Community Investment Tax Credits for the Hippest Kids project. HIP Services will sell these credits to participating individuals and corporations to support the program.

WHEREAS, HIP Services, Inc., a nonprofit organization, proposes to undertake the project described above (the "Project"); and




WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Mount Rainier, Maryland


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Mount Rainier hereby expresses approval of the Project, as described above.





RESOLUTION 10-2010**

Introduced by _____

A resolution declaring that City-owned personal property consisting of two vehicles not needed by the City of Mount Rainier for public use; and, providing for the City to dispose of the vehicles at public auction or scrap.

WHEREAS, the City owns the following motor vehicles:

2002 Ford Crown Victoria 4-door sedan vehicle identification 2FAFP71W52X105595 known as vehicle 98; and

2002 Ford Crown Victoria 4-door sedan vehicle identification 2FAFP571W02X105598, known as vehicle 99; and

WHEREAS, these vehicles are beyond repair and thus have no operational value to the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of Mount Rainier, Maryland, that the vehicles are not needed by the City for public use, are declared surplus, and shall be disposed of by public auction, by scrap, or whichever is the best means; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the City shall give not less than 20 days public notice that the vehicles have been declared surplus and the means of giving public notice shall include posting notices at City Hall, One Municipal Place Mount Rainier, Maryland 20712; and at the Police Department located at 3249 Rhode Island Avenue Mount Rainier, Maryland 20712.
